PREPARING FOR a disaster

The Mohawk & Hudson River Humane Society encourages you to develop a disaster plan to protect your entire family, including your pets. The Society will be a leading response agency if a disaster strikes the Capital District. However, there is no substitute for individuals preparing themselves and their families. Every home should have an evacuation plan and a kit that includes necessities for your pet.

Your pet emergency kit should contain:

- → Copies of veterinary records, especially records of rabies vaccinations
- → A three-day supply of pet food, water, litter and medicine
- → A carrier or crate for each pet
- → A food bowl, water bowl and litter pan
- → A collar and ID tag
 (it is also wise to have your pet microchipped)
- → A photo of your pet with a brief description including age, breed, sex and distinguishing features
- → An extra leash and collar or harness.













DEVELOP a plan

→ Never leave pets behind when you evacuate for disaster, even if you believe you'll only be gone a short time. Disasters are unpredictable and you may not be able to return home to retrieve them.



- → Work with your neighbors to develop a rescue plan for your pets when you are not home, including establishing a meeting place to reconnect with them.
- → Many evacuation shelters for people will not accept pets. Be prepared for an evacuation by making a list of petfriendly hotels or family and friends who would welcome you and your pets.
- → Post window stickers on your home that say "Pets Inside." List the number and type of pets, as well as an emergency contact number for you or a relative.



→ Familiarize yourself with your state and local disaster plans.
