## Mother Gives Life to Save Kittens

On a cold winter morning heading into the Humane Society's animal care center in Menands, one of the Society's employees noticed a cat that appeared to be sleeping or injured. There was a cardboard box nearby that was taped shut, but it appeared the cat had escaped to the side of the road. The employee stopped and, to her dismay, found a mother cat had passed away during the freezing night while keeping five kittens covered with her body. The kittens were cold and near death, but were still alive.



The five kittens, all female, were rushed to the Society's veterinary staff, where emergency warming procedures began. Later that day, a staff member went back to where the cats were found to retrieve the box for identifying information and saw a sixth kitten running nearby. He had left his mother and sisters but somehow also survived. He was caught and brought to our veterinarians to be warmed and fed.

It is hard to imagine why someone would abandon a mother and her kittens only a quarter mile from the Humane Society, where they could have been kept safe and warm. The carelessness of an individual cost a mother cat her life, but this mother cared so deeply for her kittens that she literally gave everything she had to save her babies.

Thanks to the quick work of the Humane Society's staff and the generosity of supporters like you, our veterinarians were able to save all six kittens and send them to warm, loving homes.

# From the Director

They say you can't teach an old dog new tricks. I can tell you, for a fact, that old saying just isn't true. With good positive reinforcement training, you can teach any dog, no matter the age.

But what about cats? Some people tend to get a little smirk on their faces when I mention training cats. Other people just laugh out loud. The truth is any animal can be trained if they have the right positive motivation. With that motivation, they will want to continue participating in an activity that is fun and rewarding for them.

My own cat, Sweetpea, was originally a foster kitten who came to Mohawk Hudson Humane Society without her mother or any siblings. My wife and I brought her into our home for a few weeks, and she decided to stay for five years.

A few years ago, our friend and Humane Society dog trainer Chris Danker wanted to try training a cat. Sweetpea was volunteered. Sweetpea is very focused on people and extremely food motivated, so she stood out as the best cat from our brood to try to train.

Just like we trained our dogs, Sweetpea was trained using a marker for reinforcement (a click) and a treat.

Sweetpea took to the training quickly. Before we knew it, she was sitting. Later, she could "shake hands" on command. Today, years later, she will still do it without a click or a treat – although she still gets her fair share of rewards.

My first thought when we started training our cat was, "How could we use this skill to save more cats?" At the Humane Society we have begun teaching staff and volunteers the basic skills needed to train cats. The training has two clear benefits: It mentally stimulates the cats, and it makes them more adoptable.

Granted, not many people are looking for a cat that sits and shakes, but that's not necessarily the first thing we'll train shelter cats to do. We work with the cats to help them engage more with people visiting the Society's adoption center. We work with shy cats to come to the front of the kennel and, yes, reach out like they're shaking hands to let people know how engaging and friendly they can be.

At the Humane Society our focus is always on saving more lives. Like our S.T.A.R. program for training dogs at the Albany County Correctional Facility, our new cat training program helps animals get ready for adoption and be successful in their new homes. Don't you want a cat that's been trained? I have one, and I can tell you: Shelter cats are the best, and trained shelter cats are even better. Thanks to the support of donors like you, we have the opportunity to experiment with new and innovative programs that find homes for more animals than ever before.

## London's Story

On a cool fall day in Albany, Animal Control was called to the basement of an apartment building. A resident was concerned that a dog had been left there without food, water or care. When the officer arrived, things were worse than he could have expected. The basement was so covered with urine and feces that the dog trying to survive there had burns on her feet; she had no clean place to stand. Her coat was so matted that it formed a solid shell instead of the soft hair it probably once was.



The officer immediately removed the dog and rushed her to the care of the Humane Society. Our veterinary staff started treating her burns and shaved off her matted coat, revealing an emaciated little Lhasa Apso underneath. They would name her London. On a scale of 1 to 5, London's weight was rated as a 1, meaning she was emaciated. The matted hair that was shaved from her weighed almost as much as London herself. Through it all, London just wanted the attention someone was finally willing to give her.

London would need time and treatment, but she began recovering while police searched for her abuser. With medication, treatment, regular feeding and loving care, London became a different dog, ready for a new home. Her rescue and recovery were possible only because of the supporters who donate to the Society, ensuring animals like London get the care they deserve.
